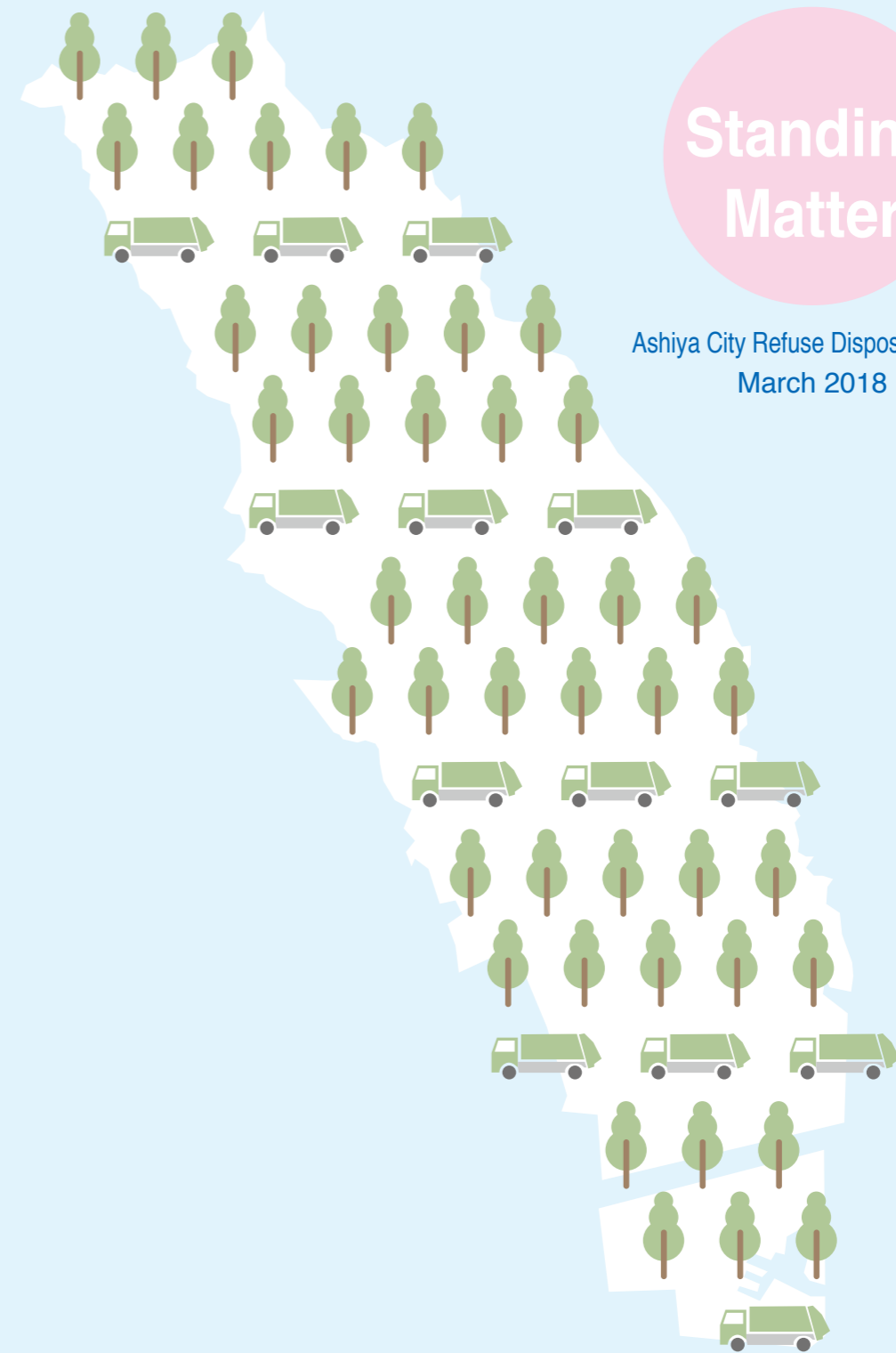

Reduce Garbage!! Reuse

Your spontaneous effort is vital to protect the townscape and environment. Please bear in mind 3R in everyday life.

Reduce

Reduce generating garbage

Reducing means keeping down the amount of garbage generated. Keeping down the amount of garbage is the most effective way to reduce garbage.



Reuse

Avoid buying disposable goods and try to reuse things

Reuse means using the goods again and again. Before throwing things away after use, think carefully if you can reuse them or anyone else can use them.



Recycle

If the goods can be reprocessed, recycle them.

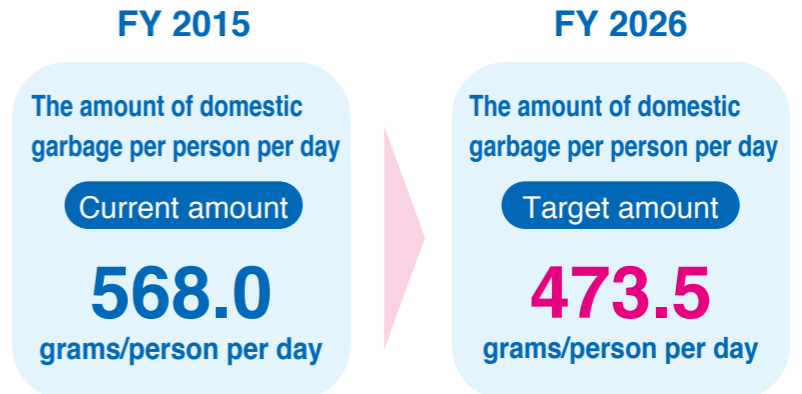
Recycling means reprocessing and reusing things which can be used as a resource. After reducing and reusing garbage, please think again whether the remains of garbage can be recycled.



and Recycle the Remaining Garbage.

We are aiming to reduce domestic garbage per person per day by 94.5g.

"Ashiya City General Waste Disposal Basic Plan (Garbage Disposal Basic Plan)" was formulated in March 2017. In the Plan, the target amount of the domestic garbage for 2026 has been set, based on the amount of domestic garbage, which was estimated to be generated and processed according to the record of the past six years (2010–2015).



Reducing and recycling garbage helps save waste disposal expenses.

Forty-one million yen of the waste disposal expense for ten years between 2017 and 2026 will be saved by promoting reducing and recycling garbage to reduce the final waste disposal amount from the estimated amount to the target amount.

Ashiya City conducts various activities to promote 3R.

- Holding Reuse Festa (approx. three times a year)
- Holding Flea Market (twice a year)

"Furniture" and "bicycles" from bulky garbage collection are provided as reclaimed goods for their effective reuse. They will be offered either for free or with a charge to people who wish to have them at the exhibition. Date of the event will be announced on City's PR papers, website, Machi Navi (Sun Television), etc.

Flea markets are held with the cooperation of Ashiya City Society of Commerce and Industry to raise interest in waste reduction and resource protection. The details will be announced on City's PR papers, website, Machi Navi (Sun Television), etc.

- Slim Recycle Promotion Shops

Shops and offices aiming to reach 11 targets (e.g. simple packaging) are designated as "Slim Recycle Promotion Shops". Waste reduction and recycling activities are promoted with collaboration of citizens, business operators and the City. As of August 2017, there are 81 designated shops and 56 shops wishing to be posted on the City's website. Owners of shops and offices are recommended to register, as that will help advertise them.

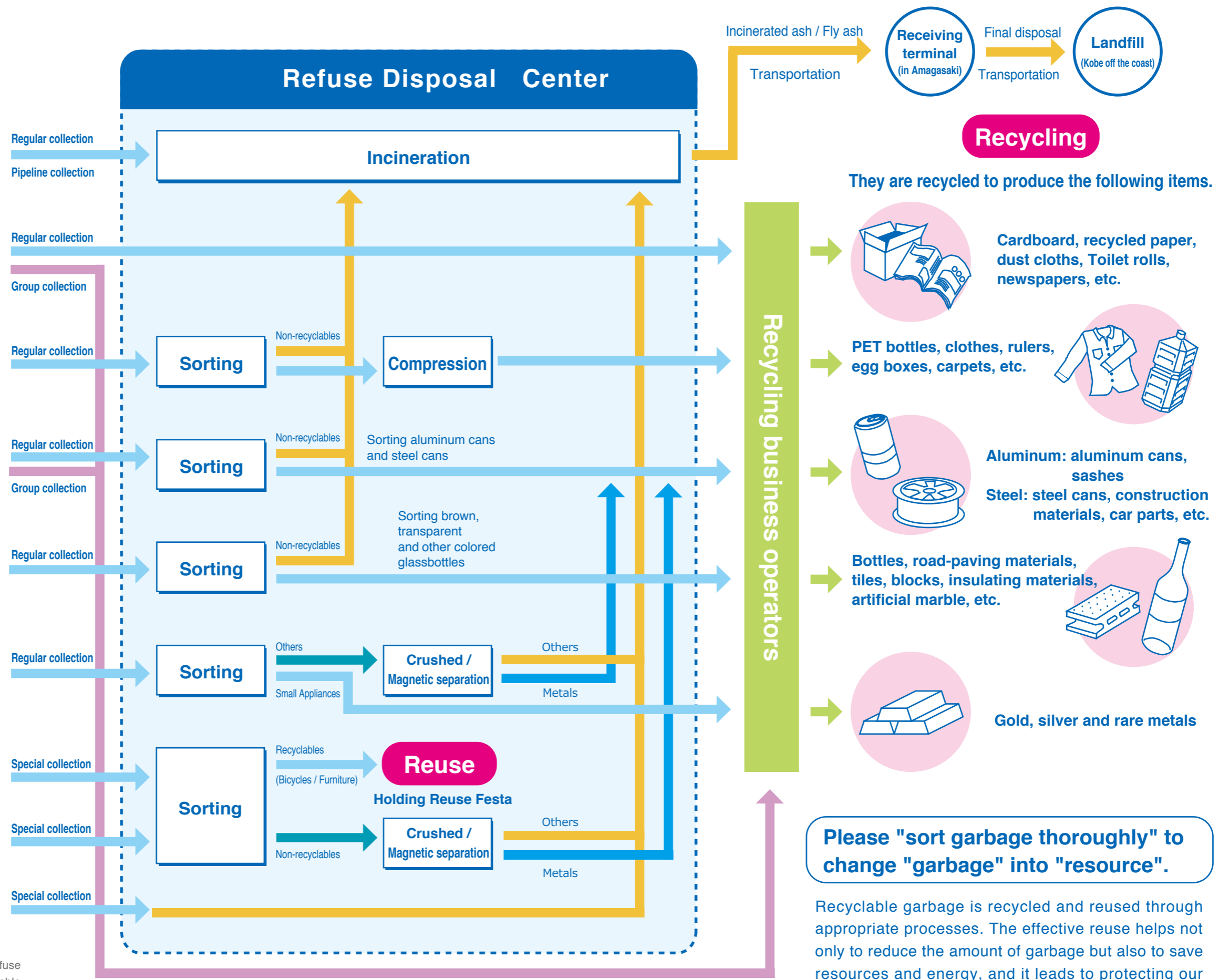

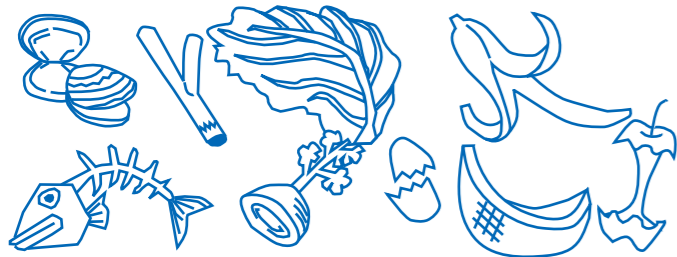
Regular Collection

2
times weekly

- "Burnable garbage" means garbage of which one side of the length, width or height is 50 cm or shorter. Garbage that is larger than that size is collected as "Bulky Garbage" (p.14 / booking required)
- Garbage is collected twice a week on the town collection days. Please refer to "Town Garbage Collection Day" (pp. 26–27). Please leave garbage at your collection point by 8:30 a.m.
- You cannot leave the "Garbage That Cannot Be Collected or Handled by the City" (pp.20–21) at the collection point.

Kitchen Garbage

- Vegetable garbage
- Eggshells
- Fish and meat bones
- Fruit peel, etc.



Top Tips

- (1) Drain off the liquid well.
- (2) Wrap it with unwanted paper.
- (3) Put it in the middle of the garbage bags.



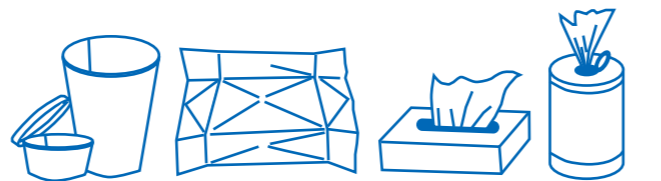
Plastics

- Styrofoam and cushioning material
- Plastic shopping bags and confectionery wrappers
- Tubes
- Caps and plastic labels of PET bottles
- Plastic toys
- Plastic trays for eggs, vegetables, fruits, etc.
- Plastic trays for fish and meat
- Plastic containers for detergent, etc.
- CDs, DVDs and videotapes
- Plastic food keepers, washbowls, etc.



Non-Recyclable Papers

- Waterproof paper such as paper cups
- Thermal paper, photosensitive paper and carbon paper
- Paper soiled with food, oil, etc.
- Photographic paper and photographic inkjet paper
- Tissue, wet tissue, etc.



Top Tips

- All "non-recyclable papers" are collected as "burnable garbage". (Please refer to "Non-Recyclable Papers" (p. 9))

Rubber, leather and clothes

- Bags and shoes
- Rubber gloves and hoses
- General clothes
- Stuffed toys, etc.
- Gauze and pieces of cloth



Top Tips

- Please use Recyclable Resources Group Collection or recycling shops in your local area for reusable items including clothes.



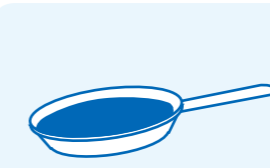
Some burnable garbage requires special attention, before being left in the collection point.



- Cigarette butts and fire works
- Cooking oil
- Bamboo skewers, toothpicks, etc.
- Diapers



Dampen them with water to extinguish fire and inflammability completely before collection.



Soak it in paper or cloth, or solidify it with coagulant before collection.



Wrap them in unwanted paper, write "危険" or "キケン" (which means danger) and put in a transparent bag for collection.



Excrement should be disposed of into the toilet before collection

- Disposable lighters



Use up all contents before collection.

- Disposable heat packs
- Desiccants and ice packs



Do not empty the packs. They are collected as they are.

- Plants, leaves and weeds

- It should be a sensible amount which is generated by everyday cleaning. In the case of large amounts, please apply for "Green Waste" (p. 18).
- Shake off the soil well before collection.
- Trees and branches should be cut within the length of 50 cm and diameter of 10 cm. Tie an amount which can be carried by one hand with a string.
- Put leaves and weeds in garbage bags.

Crow Damage Control at Domestic Garbage Collection Points

Three Steps to Prevent Crows from scavenging garbage at collection points!

Step 1

Leave your garbage not to be found by crows.

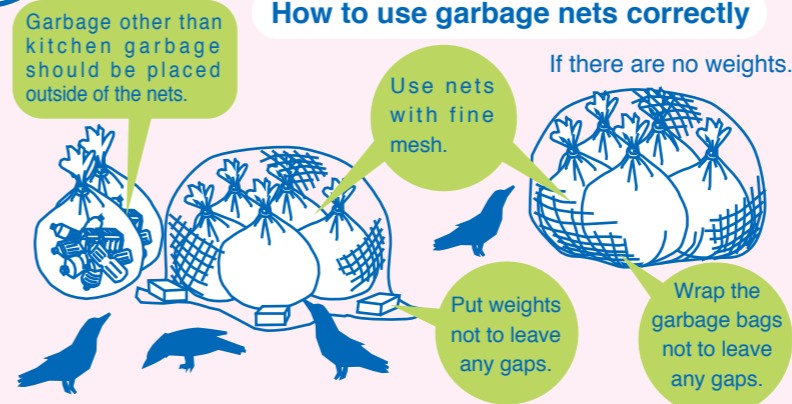
- Drain off the liquid from kitchen garbage and wrap it with unwanted paper to eliminate the smell.
- Put kitchen garbage in the middle of the bag to make it difficult for crows to spot.

Step 2

Discuss suitable control measures in your area.

- Using garbage nets and weights, or foldable boxes is effective.

How to use garbage nets correctly



• If you consider using nets or boxes.

Step 3

Your cooperation is vital for Crow Damage Control.

- Please take away garbage boxes and foldable boxes after use, cooperating with each other within the neighborhood using the same collection point.
- Please try to reduce kitchen garbage by buying only necessary food, using it all up and not leaving any.

- Please remove the air from the garbage bag containing shredded paper to prevent it from scattering on the roads.

Top Tips

- Wash inside and unfold cartons.
- Bundle cartons with string tied in a crisscross.
- Cartons coated with aluminum foil are collected as "Burnable Garbage" (pp. 6-7)
- Please bundle cartons and newspapers separately.

Collection days By 8:30 a.m., the 4th Wednesday

To reduce the amount of garbage and for the effective use of resources, please cooperate with the collection of "miscellaneous recyclable paper".

"Miscellaneous Recyclable Paper" Is a Valuable "Resource".

"Miscellaneous recyclable paper" is recyclable paper which is not categorized as cardboard, newspapers, magazines, flyers or cartons for drinks. The amount of "burnable garbage" is the largest of all types of domestic garbage. Approximately 30 to 40 % of burnable garbage is paper, and most miscellaneous recyclable paper is disposed of as burnable garbage by many households.

1 What is "miscellaneous recyclable paper"?

- Please refer to the examples in "Magazines, Flyers, etc." (p. 8).
- These will be collected as "magazines, flyers, etc."

Top Tips for Sorting

3 Are you still not sure?

- If you can tear the paper easily, it is miscellaneous recyclable paper. If not, it is collected as "burnable garbage".
- Papers with paper recycling symbols are collected as miscellaneous recyclable paper.



2 What is non-recyclable papers?

- Please refer to the examples in "Non-Recyclable Papers" below.
- These are collected as "burnable garbage".



Non-Recyclable Papers

The following types of paper are not recyclable. They are collected as "Burnable Garbage" (pp. 6-7).

- Waterproof paper (paper cups, ice cream cups, etc.)
- Thermal paper and photosensitive paper (Fax paper, photos, etc.)
- Coated paper (aluminum foil, vinyl coated paper, etc.)
- Crimped postcards
- Carbon paper and carbonless paper (courier slips, etc.)
- Non-water-soluble paper (tissue, wet tissue, etc.)
- Soiled paper (paper with food, oil, etc.)
- Paper with adhesive (sticky notes, stickers, etc.)
- Paper with materials other than paper
- Scented paper (detergent boxes, etc.)
- Photographic inkjet paper
- Heat-sensitive paper (braille paper, etc.)

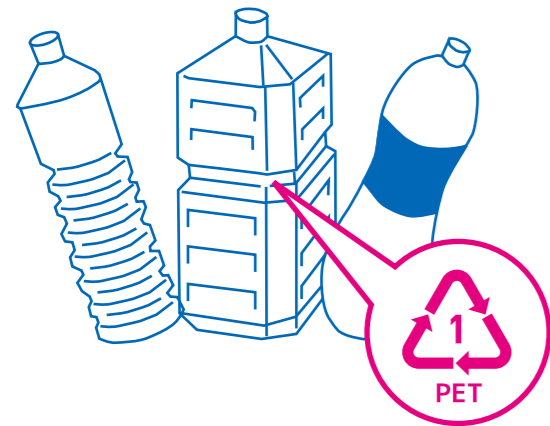

• Glass bottles of medicine, cosmetics, etc.

*Bottles made of heat-resistant glass such as feeding bottles are collected as "other non-burnable garbage".

Top Tips

- (1) Empty bottles.
- (2) Remove caps, lids and labels.
- (3) Rinse with water.
- (4) Put in a garbage bag for collection.

By 12:30 p.m.

■ If the material of the caps and labels is metal, they are collected as "Other Non-Burnable Garbage" (p.12). If they are made of paper or plastic, they are collected as "Burnable Garbage" (p.6).

■ Please return beer bottles and 1-sho (1.8 liters) bottles to liquor shops.

■ If the collection day of "PET bottles" and "glass bottles" is the same, they are collected separately. Please make sure to put them in different garbage bags and leave separately at the collection point.

! In the case of rain, please put them in plastic bags for collection as the bottom of paper bags may get torn.

Stealing recyclable resources is prohibited.

Recyclable resources are valuable for the City and its citizens. Stealing them may result in lowering citizens' incentive towards sorting garbage. It also may cause the reduction on recyclable garbage and be a bad influence on promoting recycling. Stealing recyclable resources from the collection points, including domestic garbage collection points, is prohibited in the City. Article 21 of Ashiya City Ordinance Regarding Reduction of Waste and Appropriate Disposal states: "A person who has violated the order prescribed in Article 7-2, Section 2 (Prohibition of collection or transportation) shall be punishable and liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand yen".

* Please do not approach the person stealing directly or attempt to stop his/her vehicle as it may cause trouble and be dangerous.

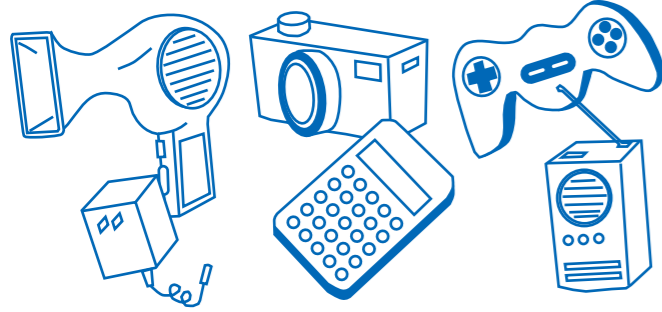

- You cannot leave "Garbage That Cannot Be Collected or Handled by the City" (pp.20-21) at the collection point.

- Dryers and irons

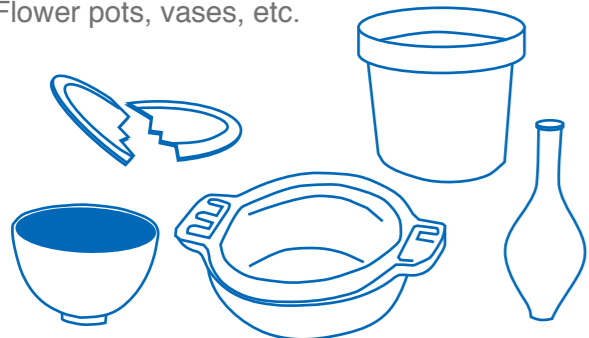

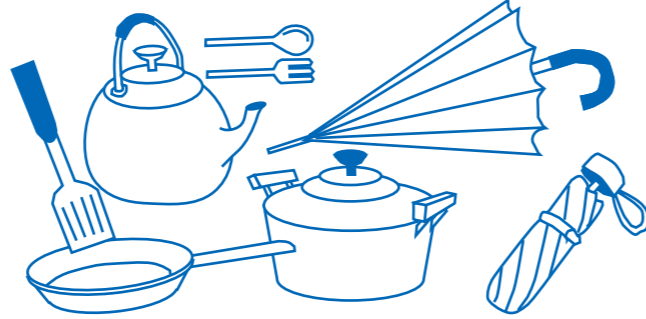

Wrap broken ceramics in cardboard, write "割れ物" or "ワレモノ" (which means broken article) and put in a transparent bag before collection.

Metals

- Frying pans and metal pots
- Spoons and forks
- Umbrellas
- Fishing weights
- *Kenzan* (metal flower holders for flower arrangement)
- Golf club heads, etc.



Top Tips

- Umbrellas with the length of more than 30 cm can still be collected as "other non-burnable garbage".

Glass

- Glass tableware
- Light bulbs and fluorescent lights
- Mirrors, etc.



Top Tips

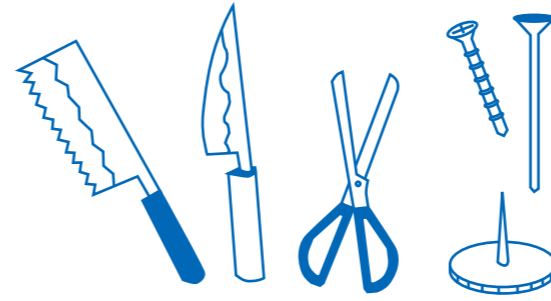
- Fluorescent lights with the length of more than 30 cm can still be collected as "other non-burnable garbage".
- Wrap fluorescent lights in paper cases or newspapers before collection.



Wrap broken glass in cardboard, write "割れ物" or "ワレモノ" (which means broken article) and put in a transparent bag before collection.

Business Waste

Business waste cannot be disposed of at domestic garbage collection points.

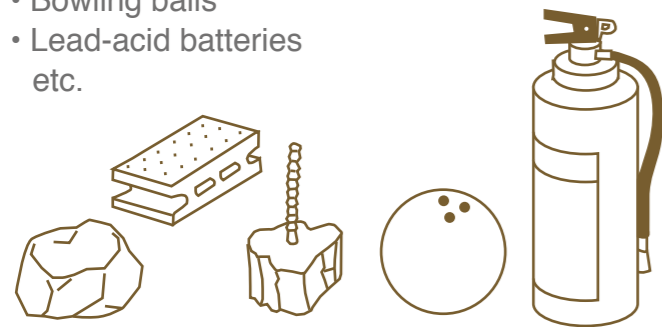
Business waste is waste generated by business activities regardless of whether for commercial or non-commercial purposes. It is differentiated from waste generated by general households. Even if shops, offices and residential areas are in the same building, waste other than domestic waste cannot be collected from domestic garbage collection points.

How to dispose

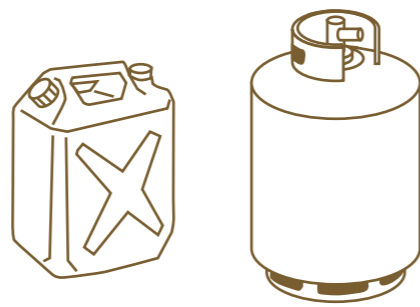

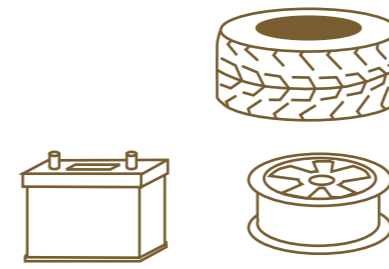

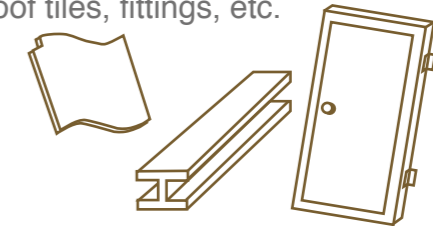

PCs

"PC Recycle" has been introduced since October 1, 2003, based on the "Law for Promotion of Effective Utilization of Resources". Some manufacturers collect PC parts and materials for recycling. Please ask for the collection to manufacturers or distributors to dispose of desktops computers, monitors (cathode-ray tube or liquid crystal) or laptop computers.

How to dispose

1 Contact the manufacturer to arrange

- Please contact the manufacturer or distributor of your PC which you wish to dispose of to arrange collection.
- Please see the manufacturer's website for contact details.

If you cannot find the "manufacturer's contact number", the "manufacturer went bankrupt" or "no manufacturer because of handmade PC", etc., please contact "PC 3R Promotion Association".

2 Receive a delivery order form from the manufacturer

- The manufacturer will send you their delivery order form of Yu-pack(parcel).
- If your PC has a symbol of "PC Recycle Mark", you **don't need to pay any fees**.
- If your PC doesn't have a symbol of "PC Recycle Mark", you **need "Recycling Collection Handling-Fees"**. (Please ask the manufacturer for payment details.)

Recyclable Resource Group Collection System

Recyclable Resource Group Collection System is the system in which the City rewards groups, such as local action groups, which conduct recyclable resource collections.

Registered groups are local groups (10 households or more per group) such as residents' associations, senior citizens' groups, organizations for local children, condominium management associations, etc.

Application procedures to claim the rewards

Please submit reward claiming forms, itemized statements and invoices for the past six months in August and February.

A reward worth 4 yen per 1 kg is provided.

The maximum amount of rewards is 800,000 yen per year per group.

Others

- Please sell recyclable resources to the registered traders in the City.
- Registered traders are not allowed to claim expenses such as collection fees. If you are charged such fees, contact the Environmental Facilities Section.

Pipeline facilities are installed in some areas in the City. Please make sure to use pipeline facilities properly and with care.

How to use pipeline correctly

• Only **"Burnable Garbage"** can be put in the pipeline.

- Only "burnable garbage" with the length between 20–30 cm can be put in the pipeline smoothly. "Non-burnable garbage" cannot be put in the pipeline.
- Do not force garbage into the slot as it causes blockages. Please divide into several bunches.

• **"Burnable garbage" which cannot fit into the slot will be collected as "other burnable garbage".**

- Cloths, plastics and plants (refer to right hand side) may cause blockages. Please leave them at your collection point as "other burnable garbage".
- Garbage of which one side of the length, width or height is 50cm or longer should be arranged to be collected as **"bulky garbage"**.

Other Non-Burnable Collection Days

Once a month / The 2nd Thursday
* Please leave it at your collection point by 8:30 a.m.

• **Please do not use keys which are worn out.**

- Keys which are worn out may slip out while processing, and the next user cannot use the pipeline. Please turn to "閉" (close) after use.

Garbage which tends to cause trouble

Cardboard, magazines and flyers frequently cause blockages in the pipeline. Please sort them and have them collected on "group collection" or "paper recyclables" days.

Plants, tree cuttings

They often cause blockages. Please make sure not to cause a blockage.

A small amount of leaves and weeds generated by everyday cleaning of the entrance or garden → **Can be put in the pipeline**
* Please remove soil well.

(Collection on the 2nd Thursday)

Sawayaka Collection

Sawayaka Collection is a service provided to the elderly or disabled people who **cannot get any help from their relatives** to leave garbage at the collection point by themselves. The service includes the collection of their garbage at their doorsteps and confirmation of their safety to help them not to have trouble in their everyday life.

Eligibility

People who satisfy (1) or (2), and are living on their own (including those who have difficulty in leaving garbage at the collection point as their cohabitant is elderly, etc.).

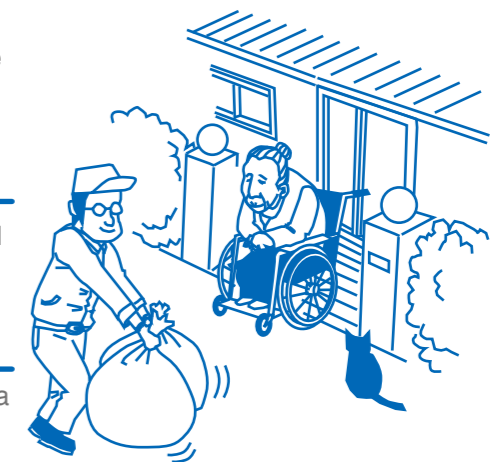
- (1) People who are approx. 65 years old or older with nursing care level 2, and using home-visit care.
- (2) People who have Physical Disability Certificate, Intellectual Disability Certificate or Mental Disability Certificate, or have incurable disease and receive home care.

How to arrange the collection

 - Please seek advice from your care manager, counseling support specialist or Garbage Collection Section.
 - Please submit an application form with the required documents to **Garbage Collection Section**.
- 2 Interview / Checking**
 - The date for interview will be arranged by phone, and the person in charge from the City will visit you.
 - Interview between the eligible person and care manager or counseling support specialist and checking will be conducted
- 3 Decision**
 - The decision of collection will be made and you will be notified of the decision.
- 4 Starting the collection**
 - Garbage will be collected at the doorstep once a week on the designated day.
 - Garbage which is not sorted cannot be collected.
